Indianapolis, Ind. -- US News and World Report examines all high schools across the nation, using a complex set of formulas to determine academic quality. It partners with North Carolina-based RTI International, a global nonprofit social science research firm, to carefully examine the data. The ranking methodology is based on the principles that a great high school must serve all of its students well, and that it must produce measurable academic outcomes to show it is successfully educating its student body across a range of performance indicators. 28,561 public high schools in all 50 states were in the initial group to be examined. High schools must meet or exceed the national standard high school graduation rate even to be ranked at a national level. A comparative factor for the academic performance of disadvantaged students is also applied.

After the ranking criteria is applied, the highest-scoring high schools in the nation are placed in Gold, Silver and Bronze categories in the following: Best STEM Schools, Best Magnet Schools, Best Charter Schools and Best Nationally Ranked Schools.

Indianapolis-based Christel House Academy (CHA) South's high school was recognized at the Bronze level in the Charter School and impressively, in the Nationally Ranked School categories. This places CHA in the top 20% of all high schools in the study.
